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## SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, a person has a duty to inform a law enforcement officer that he or she is in possession of a concealed pistol or firearm upon request.

This bill would provide that the failure of an individual to inform a law enforcement officer that he or she is in possession of a concealed pistol or firearm upon request is a Class A misdemeanor.

Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the section. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions

45	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
46	Section 1. "\$13A-11-95
47	(a) Any person who knowingly possesses a pistol or
48	firearm concealed on or about his or her person or in a
49	vehicle occupied by the person, and who is asked by a law
50	enforcement officer operating in the line or scope of his or
51	her official duties whether he or she is armed with a
52	concealed pistol or firearm, shall immediately inform the law
53	enforcement officer that the person is in possession of a
54	pistol or firearm.
55	(b) A violation of subsection (a) is a Class A
56	misdemeanor."



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57	Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose
58	or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of
59	local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements
60	and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of
61	Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or
62	amends the definition of an existing crime.
63	Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
64	1, 2024.
