23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated
25	from the named funds for the 2015-2016 fiscal year to the
26	state agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the
27	expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all

monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of
 the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

9 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total 10 of all fund sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

16 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 17 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 18 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 19 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 20 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

24 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
25 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
26 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

1 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated 2 the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, 3 4 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016, 5 to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such 6 7 other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be ex-8 9 pended for the items for which the appropriation is herein 10 made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as 11 provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 12 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, how-13 ever, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period 14 which has been or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment 15 due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in 16 17 which the pay date falls.

(a) Medical Assistance through Medicaid Program.....

Of the above appropriation, \$50,000 shall be expended for the Dental Services Project for handicapped/indigent patients. The Medicaid Agency will reimburse the Department of Public Health for actual costs (in compliance with OMB Circular A-87 and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services guidelines) for services provided. The Department of Public Health shall transfer to the Medicaid Agency the state funds attributable to the difference between their costs and Medicaid's routine reimbursement fee. Medicaid shall continue to provide hospice benefits through FY 2016 and ensure that benefits are administered to medically appropriate individuals. Any requirements for prior authorization of antipsychotic drugs will be for the limited purpose of managing off-label utilization. It is the intent of the Legislature that the appropriation made herein to the Alabama Medicaid Agency be utilized in such a manner to provide open access with no prior authorization for medications prescribed according to FDA approved indications for mental illness and HIV/AIDS. The Alabama Medicaid Agency shall not pay for a generic drug that is more expensive than its brand name drug, net of rebates. The Alabama Medicaid Agency shall make reasonable efforts to continue the PACE program.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of 9 this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for 10 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, to the various 11 state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted 12 on September 30, 2015, are hereby reappropriated to the 13 respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 14 2015.

15 Section 4. In addition to all other appropriations 16 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated 17 such amounts as may be necessary for the fiscal year ending 18 September 30, 2016, to the Retirement Systems of Alabama from 19 the Senior Services Trust Fund to comply with Section 20 41-15C-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

21 Section 5. In addition to all other appropriations 22 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby conditionally 23 appropriated any and all amounts from tobacco settlement or 24 litigation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016. The 25 amounts are conditioned upon the State of Alabama receiving 26 revenue from tobacco settlement or litigation and upon the recommendation of the Director of Finance, the Chairs of the
House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Senate

The amounts herein appropriated are the 12 maximum amounts to be expended for the purposes herein 13 designated and in no event shall the maximum expenditure 14 provided for any items of expense exceed the amount allocated 15 herein except as may be provided for under Sections 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 10, 11, and 14 of this bill, as provided in the Budget 16 17 Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and those appropriations herein made, except 18 appropriations to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board 19 for the purchase of alcoholic beverages, are and shall be 20 21 subject to the terms, conditions, provisions and limitations 22 of Sections 41-4-80 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 et seq., Code 23 24 of Alabama 1975.

25 Section 7. Any surplus remaining in any 26 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any 27 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

6 Section 8. In addition to appropriations herein 7 made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in the bill, 8 including grants by the Congress of the United States, 9 10 municipalities or counties, to any department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 11 12 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, 13 in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 14 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, 15 institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall 16 be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 17 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 18 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the 19 20 State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 21 to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by 22 said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and 23 reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of 24 Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the 25 fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

26 Section 9. The Department of Examiners of Public 27 Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary 1 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of 2 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of 3 4 Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts 5 6 to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery 7 audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama 1975. 8

Section 10. Upon certification to the Director of 9 10 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 11 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or 12 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby 13 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or 14 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such department, board, bureau or commission in the amount 15 16 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are 17 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are 18 conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination 19 by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are 20 21 not available for the court-ordered payments.

22 Section 11. All interest earned from funds paid into 23 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 24 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the 25 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of 26 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from 27 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd
 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are
 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

4 Section 12. All encumbered balances of a previous fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions 5 authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 6 7 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal year immediately following the fiscal year for which the 8 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the 9 10 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the 11 appropriation or appropriations were made.

12 Section 13. The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 13 14 the amounts necessary and said departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 15 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said 16 17 amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in this act and receiving services from other governmental 18 19 agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for 20 21 such services.

Section 14. All funds collected under Section 40-12-43.1 between the effective date of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2015 are hereby appropriated to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for the administration of the examiner certification program established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards
 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1.

Section 15. Any agency or entity, which under the 3 4 provisions of Act 2015-327 utilizes funds for the operation of such agency or entity for a purpose other than the purpose for 5 6 which the funds were dedicated, shall report such information 7 to the Chairs of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the House Ways and Means Education Committee, the 8 Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the 9 10 Senate Finance and Taxation-Education Committee and the Legislative Fiscal Officer on a quarterly basis. 11

12 Section 16. It is the intent of the Legislature that 13 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President 14 Pro Tempore in subsection 9 of Section 2A of this act which 15 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized 16 17 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of 18 19 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama 1975. 20

21 Section 17. The appropriations made herein to the 22 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 23 the amounts necessary to pay the State Employees' Insurance 24 Board (SEIB). The SEIB rate shall be \$850 per month for each 25 full-time employee for the fiscal year ending September 30, 26 2016. The State Employees' Insurance Board will adjust the

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insurance program wherever appropriate to maintain the
 aforementioned fixed rate.

Section 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of any type, including contracting, of any of the funds appropriated in this act.

10 Section 19. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 11 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion 12 of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or 13 invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, 14 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any 15 other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof 16 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

17 Section 20. All laws or parts of laws, general, 18 special, private or local that are in conflict with or 19 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby 20 expressly repealed.

21 Section 21. Each agency of the State funded through 22 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity 23 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of 24 this state without regard to sex or race.

25 Section 22. This act shall become effective October26 1, 2015.
