9	Relating to firearms; to define firearm hold
10	agreements; and to provide civil immunity for federal firearm
11	licensees who enter into firearm hold agreements under certain
12	conditions.
13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. (a) This section shall be known as and may
15	be cited as the Houston/Hunter Act.
16	(b) For the purposes of this act, the following terms
17	have the following meanings:
18	(1) FEDERAL FIREARMS LICENSEE. Any person who is
19	licensed pursuant to 18 U.S.C. Chapter 44.
20	(2) FIREARM. Has the same meaning as provided in 18
21	U.S.C. § 921.
22	(3) FIREARM HOLD AGREEMENT. A private transaction
23	between a federal firearm licensee and an individual firearm
24	owner where the licensee agrees to: (i) take physical
25	possession of the owner's lawfully possessed firearm at the
26	owner's request; (ii) hold the firearm for an agreed period of
27	time; and (iii) return the firearm to the owner.
28	(c) No individual shall have a private cause of action

against a federal firearm licensee operating lawfully in this 29 30 state for returning a firearm to the firearm owner at the termination of a firearm hold agreement. 31 32 (d) The immunity from civil liability provided in 33 subsection (c) shall not apply to any action arising from a 34 firearm hold agreement if that action is the result of 35 unlawful conduct on the part of the federal firearm licensee. 36 (e) This section shall not apply to firearm transfers 37 made in violation of Title 13A or Chapter 27 of Title 41, Code of Alabama 1975. 38 39 Section 2. This act shall become effective on June 1, 40 2025.
