8	COMMENDING THE NATION OF ISRAEL FOR ITS RELATIONS
9	WITH THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND WITH THE STATE OF
10	ALABAMA.

12	WHEREAS, Israel has been granted her lands under and
13	through the oldest recorded deed as reported in the Old
14	Testament, a tome of scripture held sacred and reverenced by
15	Jew and Christian alike, as the acts and words of God; and
16	WHEREAS, as the Grantor of said lands, God stated to
17	the Jewish people in the Old Testament, in Leviticus, Chapter
18	20, Verse 24: "Ye shall inherit their land, and I will give it
19	unto you to possess it, a land that floweth with milk and
20	honey"; and
21	WHEREAS, God has never rescinded his grant of said
22	lands; and
23	WHEREAS, along with the grant of said lands to the
24	Jewish people, God provided for the non-Jewish residents of
25	the land in commanding that governance must be in one law for

all without drawing distinction between Jewish and non-Jewish 1 2 citizens, as contained in Leviticus 24:22; and WHEREAS, the Nation of Israel declared its 3 4 independent control and governance of said lands on May 14, 5 1948, with the goal of reestablishing its God-given lands as a 6 homeland for the Jewish people; and 7 WHEREAS, the United States of America, having been the first country to recognize Israel as an independent nation 8 9 and as Israel's principal ally, has enjoyed a close and 10 mutually beneficial relationship with Israel and her people; 11 and WHEREAS, indeed, Israel is the United States of 12 13 America's greatest friend in the Mideast; and WHEREAS, the roots of Israel and the roots of the 14 United States are so intertwined that it is difficult to 15 16 separate one from the other under the word and protection of 17 almighty God; and WHEREAS, there are those in the Middle East who have 18 sought to destroy Israel from its inception as a nation; and 19 20 WHEREAS, those same haters of Israel also hate, and 21 seek to destroy, the United States of America; and 22 WHEREAS, the State of Alabama and the nation of 23 Israel have enjoyed cordial and mutually beneficial relations 24 since 1948, a friendship that continues to strengthen with

each passing year; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we commend the nation of Israel for its relations with the United States of America and with the State of Alabama.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the members of this body support Israel in its natural and God-given right of self-governance and self-defense upon its own lands, recognizing that Israel is neither an attacking force nor an occupier of the lands of others, and that peace can be afforded the region only through a united Israel governed under one law for all people.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the President of the United States, to the Alabama delegation to the United States Congress, to the Governors of all the United States of America, and to the Israeli Embassy in Washington, D.C., for transmission to all the proper authorities in the State of Israel.
