FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This legislation changes domestic violence and crime involving domestic violence under AS 18.66.990(3) and expands harassment to include when a person publishes or distributes electronic or printed photographs, pictures, or films that show the genitals, anus, or female breast of the other person or show that person engaged in a sexual act.

While it is expected that this legislation may increase the daily offender population, based on the current data available, any increase is expected to be minimal and can be absorbed within the department’s existing resources and capacity. Therefore, a zero fiscal note is submitted for this legislation.
