A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING CLARIFYING THAT THE RITUAL DISCHARGE OF BLANK AMMUNITION CARTRIDGES AT A MILITARY FUNERAL DOES NOT

103 CONSTITUTE THE CRIMINAL OFFENSE OF DISORDERLY CONDUCT.

Bill Summary

The ritual discharge of blank ammunition cartridges at a funeral for a deceased person who was a veteran of the United States armed forces does not constitute disorderly conduct.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-9-106, add (4) as
3	follows:
4	18-9-106. Disorderly conduct. (4) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY
5	PROVISION OF THIS SECTION TO THE CONTRARY, THE RITUAL DISCHARGE
6	OF BLANK AMMUNITION CARTRIDGES AT A FUNERAL FOR A DECEASED
7	PERSON WHO WAS A VETERAN OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES
8	DOES NOT CONSTITUTE DISORDERLY CONDUCT.
9	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
10	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
11	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
12	6, 2014, if adjournment sine die is on May 7, 2014); except that, if a
13	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
14	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
15	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
16	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
17	November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
18	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
