SECTION 1. Appropriation to the department of public

SECTION 3. Appropriation to the department of public
 health and environment for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013. In
 Session Laws of Colorado 2013, amend section 3 of chapter 277, (SB
 13-225), as follows:

5 Section 3. Appropriation. In addition to any other appropriation, 6 there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the general fund not 7 otherwise appropriated, to the department of public health and 8 environment, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, the sum of 9 \$41,402 and 0.6 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for 10 allocation to the emergency preparedness and response HEALTH 11 FACILITIES AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES division for the stroke 12 and STEMI heart attack designation line item related to the 13 implementation of this act.

SECTION 4. Appropriation to the department of public
health and environment for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013. In
Session Laws of Colorado 2013, section 22 of chapter 332, (SB 13-283),
amend (1) as follows:

18 Section 22. Appropriation. - SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
