SENATE BILL No. 224

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 34-28-10; IC 35-31.5-2-93.5; IC 35-47-17.

Synopsis: Disguised firearms. Defines "safety indicator" as a device or coloration designed to indicate that a toy firearm or realistic imitation firearm is not a genuine firearm. Makes it a Class C infraction to remove a safety indicator and openly carry a toy firearm or realistic imitation firearm in public. Permits a realistic imitation firearm to be used in a competition under certain conditions. Makes it a Class A misdemeanor to possess a firearm modified to resemble a toy firearm, and increases the penalty to a Level 6 felony if the person possessed the modified firearm while committing a crime.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 34-28-10 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE

4	Chapter 10. Toy Firearms Safety
5	Sec. 1. The following definitions apply throughout this chapter:
6	(1) "Realistic imitation firearm" means a device that:
7	(A) is not a firearm (as defined in IC 35-47-1-5);
8	(B) is designed to resemble a firearm; and
9	(C) may be used competitively or for target shooting.
0	The term includes a BB gun, a pellet gun, an airsoft gun, and
1	a paintball gun.
2	(2) "Safety indicator" means any device or coloration on a toy
3	firearm or realistic imitation firearm designed to show at a
4	distance that the toy firearm or realistic imitation firearm is
5	not a real firearm. The term includes:
6	(A) orange coloring on the body or barrel of the toy



1	firearm or realistic imitation firearm; and
2	(B) an orange barrel plug at the muzzle end of the barrel
3	of the toy firearm or realistic imitation firearm.
4	(3) "Toy firearm" means a device that:
5	(A) resembles a firearm;
6	(B) is primarily marketed for sale to children; and
7	(C) is not used competitively.
8	Sec. 2. Except as provided in section 3 of this chapter, a person
9	who:
10	(1) removes a safety indicator from a toy firearm or realistic
11	imitation firearm; and
12	(2) without enclosing the toy firearm or realistic imitation
13	firearm in an opaque case or container, carries the toy
14	firearm or realistic imitation firearm in a public place or
15	location open to the general public;
16	commits a Class C infraction.
17	Sec. 3. Section 2 of this chapter does not apply to a realistic
18	imitation firearm at a competition or target range if:
19	(1) the competition or target shooting takes place on private
20	property and is not open to the general public; or
21	(2) the competition or target shooting takes place in a
22	specifically demarcated area or building and the nature of the
23	event is clearly indicated by signs.

29	SECTION 3. IC 35-47-17 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
30	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
31	JULY 1, 2015]:
32	Chapter 17. Disguised Firearms
33	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "disguised firearm" means a
34	firearm that has been modified or camouflaged so that the firearm
35	appears to be a toy or replica firearm. The term includes a
36	firearm:
37	(1) modified to resemble a toy or replica firearm by:
38	(A) painting the firearm or part of the firearm in a high
39	visibility color commonly used on toy or replica firearms;
40	or
41	(B) attaching a high visibility piece to the firearm, such as
42	an orange barrel tip, that resembles high visibility pieces



1	commonly attached to toy or replica firearms; or
2	(2) that has been camouflaged by:
3	(A) placing it inside a toy or replica firearm; or
4	(B) attaching parts of a toy or replica firearm to the
5	exterior of the firearm.
6	The term does not include a firearm with an attached hunter
7	orange stock, grip, or other part, if the stock, grip, or other part
8	was specifically manufactured or marketed for the purpose of
9	hunter safety.
10	Sec. 2. A person who knowingly or intentionally possesses a
11	disguised firearm commits possession of a disguised firearm, a
12	Class A misdemeanor. However, the offense is a Level 6 felony if
13	the person possesses the firearm while committing a crime.
