## **HOUSE MOTION**

## MR. SPEAKER:

I move that House Bill 1405 be amended to read as follows:

1	Page 1, between the enacting clause and line 1, begin a new
2	paragraph and insert:
3	"SECTION 1. IC 12-7-2-190.2, AS ADDED BY P.L.262-2019,
4	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
5	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 190.2. (a) "Task force", for purposes of
6	IC 12-11-15.5, has the meaning set forth in IC 12-11-15.5-1. This
7	subsection expires December 31, 2025.
8	(b) This section expires December 31, 2025. "Task force", for
9	purposes of IC 12-15-33.7, has the meaning set forth in
10	IC 12-15-33.7-1.".
11	Page 1, between lines 10 and 11, begin a new paragraph and insert:
12	"SECTION 3. IC 12-15-33.7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
13	AS A <b>NEW</b> CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
14	UPON PASSAGE]:
15	Chapter 33.7. Medicaid Public Buy In Task Force
16	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "task force" refers to the
17	Medicaid public buy in task force established by section 2 of this
18	chapter.
19	Sec. 2. (a) The Medicaid public buy in task force is established.
20	(b) The task force shall consist of the following members:
21	(1) The secretary or the secretary's designee.

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1	(2) The director of the office of Medicaid policy and planning.
2	(3) Three (3) members appointed by the governor who have
3	knowledge of the need of Indiana residents for insurance
4	coverage.
5	(4) One (1) member of the senate appointed by the president
6	pro tempore of the senate.
7	(5) One (1) member of the senate appointed by the minority
8	leader of the senate.
9	(6) One (1) member of the house of representatives appointed
0	by the speaker of the house of representatives.
1	(7) One (1) member of the house of representatives appointed
2 3	by the minority leader of the house of representatives.
4	Sec. 3. (a) The task force shall do the following:  (1) Determine the feasibility of implementing a state entire
5	(1) Determine the feasibility of implementing a state option for health care coverage that leverages existing health care
6	infrastructure, improves quality of care, and increases and
7	provides stable access to affordable health insurance for
8	Indiana residents, including consideration of the following:
9	(A) Feasibility of creating a statewide program to provide
20	health insurance coverage to additional Indiana residents.
21	(B) Availability of, and access to, federal funding for the
22	plan, including through the use of any Medicaid state plan
23	amendments or Medicaid waivers.
.4	(C) Feasibility of leveraging tax credits currently available
2.5	to individuals participating in health care exchanges.
26	(D) Ability to leverage existing state health care
27	infrastructure.
28	(E) Identification of the targeted population that would be
.9	eligible, the number of Indiana residents that would
0	qualify for coverage under the proposal, and any costs for
1	which an eligible individual would be responsible.
2	(F) Evaluation of provider rates in determining rates that
3	would create incentives for provider participation, quality
4	health care, and network adequacy.
5	(G) Feasibility of allowing small business employers to
6	participate in the program.
7	(H) Evaluation of any impact the program would have on
8	the small group health insurance market.  (I) Evaluation of whether the plan should be offered
.0	through risk based managed care, fee for service, or any
1	other alternative format.
2	(J) Any administrative and financial burdens to the state
3	in the implementation of the plan.
4	(K) Inclusion of health care coverage that complies with
5	PPACA (as defined in IC 27-2-9.1-4).
-6	(2) Prepare the report described in section 4 of this chapter.
7	(b) The task force shall consult with health insurance experts,

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1	consumer advocates, employers, insurers, and health care
2	providers in the performance of the task force's duties.
3	(c) The office of the secretary shall conduct, or have conducted,
4	actuarial research to identify the potential cost of premiums and
5	cost sharing for participants in a proposed plan.
6	Sec. 4. (a) Before December 1, 2021, the task force shall submit
7	a written report with the task force's findings under this chapter
8	to the following:
9	(1) The governor.
10	(2) The budget committee.
11	(3) The interim study committee on public health, behavioral
12	health, and human services established by IC 2-5-1.3-4(14).
13	(b) The report under subsection (a) must be submitted to the
14	interim study committee described in subsection (a)(3) in an
15	electronic format under IC 5-14-6.".
16	Page 26, after line 12, begin a new paragraph and insert:
17	"SECTION 24. An emergency is declared for this act.".
18	Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
