5	<u>(1)</u>	The	General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky finds that:
6		<u>(a)</u>	Section 1 of the Constitution of Kentucky provides, in part, that all men
7			have an inalienable right to bear arms in defense of themselves and the
8			state;
9		<u>(b)</u>	The Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States provides,
10			"A well regulated militia, being necessary to the security of a free state, the
11			right of the people to keep and bear arms, shall not be infringed";
12		<u>(c)</u>	The Supreme Court of the United States, in the case of Printz v. United
13			States, 521 U.S. 898 (1997), affirmed that the federal government does not
14			have the authority to commandeer local or state agents to enforce federal
15			policy;
16		<u>(d)</u>	Article I, Section 8 of the Constitution of the United States specifies the
17			powers of the Congress of the United States. Those powers do not include
18			impairing the Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States
19			or any other amendment to the Constitution of the United States that
20			guarantees rights to the people or to a state;
21		<u>(e)</u>	Article II, Section 2 of the Constitution of the United States specifies the
22			powers of the President of the United States. That section does not authorize
23			the President of the United States to violate the Constitution of the United
24			States or the amendments to the Constitution of the United States;
25		<u>(f)</u>	The Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States provides,
26			"The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor
27			prohibited by it to the states, are reserved to the states respectively, or to the

1			people"; ana
2		<u>(g)</u>	The Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States
3			provides, in part, "No state shall make or enforce any law which shall
4			abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor
5			shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due
6			process of law."
7	<u>(2)</u>	The	General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky declares that:
8		<u>(a)</u>	It is the duty of the General Assembly and its members to protect and defend
9			the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of Kentucky;
10		<u>(b)</u>	All federal acts, laws, orders, rules, and regulations, enacted after the
11			effective date of this Act, which attempt to commandeer local or state law
12			enforcement officers to enforce federal restrictions on firearms violate the
13			Constitution of the United States and are:
14			1. Invalid in this Commonwealth;
15			2. Not recognized by this Commonwealth;
16			3. Considered null and void by this Commonwealth; and
17			4. Of no effect in this Commonwealth;
18		<u>(c)</u>	Proposed executive actions by the President of the United States relating to
19			the acquisition, possession, and use of firearms and accessories violate the
20			President's powers under the Constitution of the United States and the
21			rights of the citizens under the Constitution of the United States and
22			amendments thereto; and
23		<u>(d)</u>	It shall be the duty of the Kentucky General Assembly to adopt and enact
24			any and all measures as may be necessary to prevent the enforcement of any
25			federal act, law, order, rule, or regulation enacted after the effective date of
26			this Act which attempts to commandeer local or state law enforcement
2.7			officers to enforce federal restrictions on firearms in violation of the
