Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 473.123, subdivision 2a, is amended to read: 18 Subd. 2a. Terms. Following each apportionment of council districts, as provided 19 under subdivision 3a, council members must be appointed from newly drawn districts as 1 10 provided in subdivision 3a. Each council member, other than the chair, must reside in the 1 11 council district represented. Each council district must be represented by one member of the 1.12 eouneil. The terms of members end with the term of the governor are staggered as follows: 1.13 members representing even-numbered districts have terms ending the first Monday in 1.14 January of the year ending in the numeral "7"; and members representing odd-numbered 1.15

districts have terms ending the first Monday in January of the year ending in the numeral

1.17 "5." Thereafter the term of each member is four years, with terms ending the first Monday

in January, except that all terms expire on the effective date of the next apportionment.

EFFECTIVE DATE; APPLICATION. This section is effective the day following final enactment and applies in the counties of Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott, and Washington.

- Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 473.123, subdivision 3, is amended to read: 2.4 Subd. 3. Membership; appointment; qualifications. (a) Sixteen members must be 2.5 appointed by the governor from districts defined by this section. Each council member 2.6 must reside in the council district represented. Each council district must be represented 2.7 by one member of the council. Each Metropolitan Council member must be an elected city 2.8 council member or mayor, or county commissioner. A Metropolitan Council member's 2.9 office becomes vacant if the person appointed to that position ceases to be an elected city 2.10 council member or mayor, or county commissioner. 2.11
- (b) In addition to the notice required by section 15.0597, subdivision 4, notice of
 vacancies and expiration of terms must be published in newspapers of general circulation
 in the metropolitan area and the appropriate districts. The governing bodies of the statutory
 and home rule charter cities, counties, and towns having territory in the district for which
 a member is to be appointed must be notified in writing. The notices must describe the
 appointments process and invite participation and recommendations on the appointment.
- (c) The governor shall create a nominating committee, composed A committee of 2.18 seven metropolitan citizens appointed by the governor, to shall nominate persons for 2.19 appointment to the council from districts. Three of the committee members must be local 2.20 elected officials appointed by Metro Cities, one must be a county commissioner appointed 2.21 by the Association of Minnesota Counties, and three must be appointed by the governor. 2.22 Following the submission of applications as provided under section 15.0597, subdivision 2.23 5, the nominating committee shall conduct public meetings, after appropriate notice, to 2.24 2.25 accept statements from or on behalf of persons who have applied or been nominated for appointment and to allow consultation with and secure the advice of the public and local 2.26 elected officials. The committee shall hold the meeting on each appointment in the district 2.27 or in a reasonably convenient and accessible location in the part of the metropolitan area 2.28 in which the district is located. The committee may consolidate meetings. Following 2.29 the meetings, the committee shall submit to the governor a list of nominees for each 2.30 appointment. The governor is not required to appoint from the list. 2.31
- 2.32 (d) Before making an appointment, the governor shall consult with all members of2.33 the legislature from the council district for which the member is to be appointed.
- 2.34 (e) Appointments to the council are subject to the advice and consent of the senate as2.35 provided in section 15.066.

- 3.1 (f) Members of the council must be appointed to reflect fairly the various

- 3.3 (g) Members of the council must be persons knowledgeable about urban and
 3.4 metropolitan affairs.

 3.6 for the unexpired term. In filling a vacancy, the governor may forgo the requirements

 members of the council as the 17th voting member thereof by and with the advice and
 consent of the senate to serve at the pleasure of the governor_council to represent the
 metropolitan area at large. Senate confirmation shall be as provided by section 15.066.
- 3.18 The chair of the Metropolitan Council shall, if present, preside at meetings of the 3.19 council, have the primary responsibility for meeting with local elected officials, serve as 3.20 the principal legislative liaison, present to the governor and the legislature, after council 3.21 approval, the council's plans for regional governance and operations, serve as the principal 3.22 spokesperson of the council, and perform other duties assigned by the council or by law.
- (b) The Metropolitan Council shall elect other officers as it deems necessary for
