Subo	d. 2. Prohibition. It is unlawful for a person to transfer a semiautomatic military-style
assault <u>'</u>	weapon.
Subo	d. 3. Exceptions. Subdivision 2 does not apply to a transfer:
<u>(1) t</u>	between any government officer, agent, or employee; member of the armed forces
of the U	Inited States; or peace officer for official use by the recipient; or
(2) b	by a dealer that is properly licensed under applicable laws to any branch of the armed
forces o	f the United States or to a law enforcement agency within Minnesota for use by tha
agency	or its employees for law enforcement.
Subo	d. 4. Penalty. A person who violates subdivision 2 is guilty of a felony and may be

commis	sioner. To implement this section, the commissioner may collaborate with state and
ocal lav	w enforcement agencies to provide buyback locations throughout the state.
<u>(b)</u> A	A person participating in this program is not in violation of Minnesota Statutes,
section	624.7145, subdivision 2.
Subo	d. 2. Appropriation. \$ in fiscal year 2026 and \$ in fiscal year 2027 are
appropr	iated from the general fund to the commissioner of public safety to implement this
section.
