## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 405**

Introduced by Davis, 43; Howard, 9. Read first time January 16, 2015 Committee:

- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to Alzheimer's and related disorders; to
   create a work group; to provide a termination date; to provide
   powers and duties; and to declare an emergency.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

| 1  | Section 1. (1) The Alzheimer's and Related Disorders Advisory Work               |
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| 2  | <u>Group is created. The work group shall have a membership of thirteen</u>      |
| 3  | persons including the chief executive officer of the Department of Health        |
| 4  | and Human Services or his or her designee, two members of the Legislature        |
| 5  | appointed by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council as nonvoting         |
| 6  | members of the work group, the Public Guardian or his or her designee as         |
| 7  | <u>a nonvoting member of the work group, and the following members appointed</u> |
| 8  | by the Governor: One representative of the area agencies on aging, one           |
| 9  | representative of an organization advocating for patients and caregivers         |
| 10 | for patients with Alzheimer's or related disorders, one representative of        |
| 11 | the law enforcement community, one representative of patients with               |
| 12 | <u>Alzheimer's or related disorders, one representative of caregivers for</u>    |
| 13 | patients with Alzheimer's or related disorders, and four representatives         |
| 14 | selected from any of the following categories: Client advocacy                   |
| 15 | organizations; health care provider advocacy organizations; private              |
| 16 | health care providers; and community-based health professionals.                 |
| 17 | <u>(2) The members shall select a chairperson and a vice chairperson</u>         |
| 18 | from among the membership.   |
| 19 | <u>(3) The members shall not be reimbursed for their service on the</u>          |
| 20 | work group but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses as            |
| 21 | provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177. The work group may work with a          |
| 22 | private organization to provide administrative support.                          |
| 23 | Sec. 2. The Alzheimer's and Related Disorders Advisory Work Group                |
| 24 | shall meet and organize as soon as possible after the effective date of          |
| 25 | <u>this act. The work group shall develop a state plan as provided in</u>        |

26 <u>section 3 of this act and electronically deliver the state plan to the</u>
27 <u>Governor and the Legislature on or before December 15, 2016. The work</u>
28 <u>group shall make a presentation of the state plan to the Health and Human</u>

29 <u>Services Committee of the Legislature on or before December 15, 2016. The</u>
30 <u>work group shall terminate on December 31, 2016.</u>

31 Sec. 3. (1) The Alzheimer's and Related Disorders Advisory Work

| 3  | (a) Assess the current and future impact of Alzheimer's and related         |
| 4  | disorders on residents of the state;  |
| 5  | (b) Determine the existing services and resources in the state that         |
| 6  | address the needs of individuals with Alzheimer's and related disorders     |
| 7  | and their families and caregivers; and                                      |
| 8  | (c) Develop recommendations to respond to escalating needs for the          |
| 9  | services and resources described in subdivision (b) of this subsection.     |
| 10 | (2) In fulfilling the duties described in subsection (1) of this            |
| 11 | section, the work group shall examine:                                      |
| 12 | <u>(a) Trends and needs in the state relating to populations with</u>       |
| 13 | Alzheimer's or related disorders, including (i) the state's role in the     |
| 14 | provision of long-term care, (ii) family caregiver support, (iii) the       |
| 15 | provision of early-stage diagnoses, assistance, support, and medical        |
| 16 | services, (iv) younger onset of Alzheimer's or related disorders, (v)       |
| 17 | ethnic populations at higher risk, and (vi) risk reduction;                 |
| 18 | (b) Existing services, resources, and capacity available to                 |
| 19 | individuals with Alzheimer's or related disorders, including:               |
| 20 | (i) The type, cost, availability, and adequacy of services,                 |
| 21 | including, (A) home and community-based resources, (B) respite care, (C)    |
| 22 | residential long-term care, and (D) geriatric-psychiatric units for         |
| 23 | individuals with associated behavioral disorders;                           |
| 24 | (ii) Dementia-specific training requirements for individuals who are        |
| 25 | employed to provide care to individuals with Alzheimer's or related         |
| 26 | <u>disorders;</u>   |
| 27 | (iii) Quality of care measures for services delivered across the            |
| 28 | <u>continuum of care;</u>   |
| 29 | (iv) The capacity of public safety and law enforcement to respond to        |
| 30 | individuals with Alzheimer's or related disorders; and                      |
| 31 | <u>(v) State support to institutions of higher learning for research on</u> |

Alzheimer's or related disorders;
(c) The need for state policy or action in order to provide clear,
coordinated services and support to individuals with Alzheimer's or
related disorders and their families and caregivers; and
(d) Strategies to identify gaps in services.

6 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when 7 passed and approved according to law.
