## **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1332**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 62.1-02 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the carrying of a concealed firearm on school property by qualified
- 3 individuals; and to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 62.1-02-05 of the North Dakota
- 4 Century Code, relating to an exception to the prohibition against possessing a firearm at a
- 5 public gathering.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 62.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 8 and enacted as follows:

9	<u>Arm</u>	<u>ed first responder in schools - Possession of a concealed weapon - Liability.</u>
10	<u>1.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules to administer this section and
11		develop criteria for approval of plans under this section.
12	<u>2.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction may accept a proposal from a public school,
13		upon approval by the school board or governing board, indicating the intention by the
14		school to participate in an armed first responder program.
15	<u>3.</u>	Within ninety days of informing the superintendent of public instruction of the intent to
16		participate in the program, the school shall:
17		a. Identify the individual selected by the school to participate in the program and
18		attend training to become the school's armed first responder;
19		b. Submit a plan to the superintendent of public instruction specifying how the
20		school will implement the program; and
21		c. Participate in a comprehensive emergency operations assessment for the
22		purpose of identifying school crisis and emergency threats and risks.
23	<u>4.</u>	The plan submitted by the school to the superintendent of public instruction must show
24		response time from law enforcement.

1	<u>5.</u>	The	e plan submitted by the school to the superintendent of public instruction must be	
2		<u>app</u>	proved by local law enforcement and the department of homeland security.	
3	<u>6.</u>	<u>The</u>	e plan submitted by the school to the superintendent of public instruction must	
4		req	uire the selected individual to complete training equivalent to the South Dakota	
5		<u>sch</u>	ool sentinel program as established on August 1, 2019, or complete the course	
6		<u>esta</u>	ablished by the private investigative and security board.	
7	<u>7.</u>	<u>An</u>	individual selected to become an armed first responder for a school participating in	
8		<u>the</u>	program:	
9		<u>a.</u>	Must be a retired law enforcement officer or meet the requirements of	
10			subsection 6;	
11		<u>b.</u>	Must be a citizen of the United States;	
12		<u>C.</u>	Must be at least twenty-one years old;	
13		<u>d.</u>	Shall complete a criminal background check successfully and be approved by the	
14			local law enforcement agencies with jurisdiction over the school premises where	
15			the individual will be an armed first responder;	
16		<u>e.</u>	Must be a high school graduate or meet equivalency standards;	
17		<u>f.</u>	Shall complete successfully a physical performed by a physician or an advanced	
18			practice registered nurse and a mental evaluation by a qualified mental health	
19			provider who certifies the individual is capable of performing the duties of an	
20			armed first responder:	
21		<u>g.</u>	Shall complete successfully a faculty and administrator safety training and	
22			emergency response program in addition to the requirements under	
23			subsection 6;	
24		<u>h.</u>	Must be approved by the school board or governing board to carry a firearm	
25			concealed on school property; and	
26		<u>i.</u>	Shall possess a valid class 1 firearm license from this state.	
27		<u>j.</u>	May not be directly responsible for the supervision of children at the time of an	
28			incident requiring an action by an armed first responder.	
29	<u>8.</u>	An individual selected to become an armed first responder at a school participating in		
30		<u>the</u>	program shall cooperate in training with local law enforcement for school	
31		eme	ergencies to provide a coordinated response to building lockdown and active killer	

1		events. The individual shall attend annual training and recertification courses		
2		consisting of a minimum of ten hours of instruction and a skills evaluation assessment.		
3	<u>9.</u>	The school board or governing board of any school participating in the program shall		
4		inform local law enforcement, in writing, of the name of the individual authorized by the		
5		school to participate in the program.		
6	<u>10.</u>	The school board or governing board of any school participating in the program shall		
7		ensure the district participates in annual active shooter training.		
8	<u>11.</u>	An individual selected as an armed first responder may not carry a firearm concealed		
9		or a dangerous weapon on school premises unless:		
10		a. The individual has been approved by the school board or governing body under		
11		subsection 7;		
12		b. The individual has completed the armed first responder curriculum requirements		
13		under subsections 6 and 7; and		
14		c. The individual completes the armed first responder recertification course		
15		requirements every twelve months.		
16	<u>12.</u>	A firearm or dangerous weapon carried by an armed first responder on school		
17		premises must remain concealed and under the direct control of the certified armed		
18		first responder or stored in a lockbox accessible only by the armed first responder.		
19	<u>13.</u>	The school board or governing board shall approve a posttraumatic stress disorder		
20		treatment program for armed first responders.		
21	<u>14.</u>	The school board or governing board may withdraw a school from participation in the		
22		program at anytime.		
23	<u>15.</u>	A school participating in the program shall provide program evaluation data to the		
24		superintendent of public instruction at the time and in the manner requested by the		
25		superintendent of public instruction.		
26	<u>16.</u>	The board of a school district or the governing body of a nonpublic school may		
27		establish a program for providing a plan to establish a school first responder which		
28		includes authorizing an individual to conceal and carry a weapon if the individual has		
29		received education and training in accordance with this section.		
30	<u>17.</u>	A staff member may choose not to function in the capacity of a school first responder.		

1	<u>18.</u>	<u>An i</u>	ndividual authorized to work as a first responder under subsection 16, a school				
2		<u>dist</u> i	rict, the board of a school district, or the governing body of a nonpublic school that				
3		<u>esta</u>	ablishes a first responder program is not civilly or criminally liable for any act or				
4		omi	ssion of the first responder if the first responder is acting in good faith while				
5		<u>pro</u> v	viding protection to a student or the school, except if the first responder's conduct				
6		amo	ounts to gross negligence.				
7	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 62.1-02-05 of the North Dakota						
8	Century	Code	e is amended and reenacted as follows:				
9	2.	This	s section does not apply to:				
10		a.	A law enforcement officer, or a correctional officer employed by the department				
11			of corrections and rehabilitation or by a correctional facility governed by				
12			chapter 12-44.1. A correctional officer employed by the department of				
13			corrections and rehabilitation may carry a firearm only as authorized in				
14			section 12-47-34. A correctional officer employed by a correctional facility				
15			governed by chapter 12-44.1 may carry a firearm or dangerous weapon only				
16			as authorized in section 12-44.1-30;				
17		b.	A member of the armed forces of the United States or national guard, organized				
18			reserves, state defense forces, or state guard organizations, when on duty;				
19		C.	A competitor participating in an organized sport shooting event;				
20		d.	A gun or antique show;				
21		e.	A participant using a blank cartridge firearm at a sporting or theatrical event;				
22		f.	A firearm or dangerous weapon carried in a temporary residence or motor				
23			vehicle;				
24		g.	A student and an instructor at a hunter safety class;				
25		h.	Private and public security personnel while on duty;				
26		i.	A state or federal park;				
27		j.	An instructor, a test administrator, an official, or a participant in educational,				
28			training, cultural, or competitive events involving the authorized use of a				
29			dangerous weapon if the event occurs with permission of the person or entity				
30			with authority over the function or premises in question;				
31		k.	An individual in a publicly owned or operated rest area or restroom;				

1	I.	An individual possessing a valid concealed weapons license from this state or
2		who has reciprocity under section 62.1-04-03.1 authorizing the individual to carry
3		a dangerous weapon concealed if the individual is in a church building or other
4		place of worship and has the approval to carry in the church building or other
5		place of worship by a primary religious leader of the church or other place of
6		worship or the governing body of the church or other place of worship;
7	m.	A state, federal, or municipal court judge, a district court magistrate judge or
8		judicial referee, and a staff member of the office of attorney general if the
9		individual maintains the same level of firearms proficiency as is required by the
10		peace officer standards and training board for law enforcement officers. A local
11		law enforcement agency shall issue a certificate of compliance under this section
12		to an individual who is proficient; and
13	n.	An individual's storage of a firearm or dangerous weapon in a building that is
14		owned or managed by the state or a political subdivision, provided:
15		(1) The individual resides in the building;
16		(2) The storage is inside the individual's assigned residential unit; and
17		(3) The storage has been consented to by the state, the governing board, or a
18		designee <u>; and</u>
19	<u>0.</u>	An individual authorized to carry a concealed weapon on school property under
20		section 1 of this Act.
