BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, The United States Environmental Protection Agency	4
(USEPA) has proposed a new clean water rule to include small	5
streams, wetlands, and source waters under the protection of	6
USEPA and the United States Army Corps of Engineers; and	7
WHEREAS, The new USEPA rule would increase the regulatory	8
power of USEPA and require farmers to obtain expensive permits	9
for routine tasks, subject farmers to large fines for current	10
drainage measures, and decrease the value of farmland; and	11
WHEREAS, The proposed rule would negatively impact the	12
rights of Ohio's small businesses, farmers, and manufacturers	13
and would unilaterally expand federal power over waters in a way	14
that presents serious consequences for Ohio's economy,	15
threatening jobs, inviting costly litigation, and restricting	16
the ability of landowners to make decisions about their	17
property; and	18
WHEREAS, The United States House of Representatives has	19
passed H.R. 1732, the Regulatory Integrity Protection Act of	20
