COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE
An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending
21 O.S. 2011, Section 53, which relates to attempts to conceal the birth or death of a child; making
certain acts unlawful; providing penalty; and providing an effective date.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 53, is
amended to read as follows:
Section 53. A. Every parent who attempts to intentionally
conceal the existence of a child and maliciously deprives the other
parent of a right to custody or a right to visitation through the
denial of the existence of the child shall, upon conviction, be
guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in the county
jail for a term not exceeding one (1) year, or by a fine not
exceeding Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by both such fine and
imprisonment.

1	B. Every woman person who, having been convicted of endeavoring
2	to conceal the birth of an issue of her body <u>a child</u> , which, if born
3	alive, would be a bastard, or the death of any such issue child
4	under the age of two (2) years, subsequently to such conviction
5	endeavors to conceal any such birth or death of issue of her body, <u>a</u>
6	child shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony punishable by
7	imprisonment in the State Penitentiary custody of the Department of
8	Corrections for a term not exceeding five (5) years and not less
9	than two (2) years.
10	C. In any proceeding regarding a violation of this section, the
11	defendant shall have the right to claim the affirmative defense of
12	"self-defense" or "defense of others" by providing evidence of
13	domestic abuse, as such term is defined in Section 644 of this
14	title, or sexual abuse, as such term is defined in Section 843.5 of
15	this title.
16	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
