9	2011, Section 5003.10d, which relates to membership; modifying membership; requiring compliance with the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act; deleting language; allowing certain ex-officio		
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11	members; updating references; providing for certain subcommittee; stating purpose and duties; and		
12	providing an effective date.		
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 5003.10d, is		
17	amended to read as follows:		
18	Section 5003.10d. A. The Governor's Council for Workforce and		
19	Economic Development established under the authority of Executive		
20	Order 2005-27 is hereby recognized by the Legislature as the State's		
21	Workforce Investment Board. The Council succeeded and was		
22	established in lieu of the Oklahoma Workforce Investment Board.		
23	Appointed members of the Council serving under the authority of		
24	Executive Order 2005-27 when this act becomes effective shall		

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continue to serve until their terms have expired and their
 successors have been duly appointed.

3 Pursuant to the federal Workforce Investment Innovation and 4 <u>Opportunity</u> Act, the purpose of the Council shall be to: 5 1. Guide the development of a comprehensive and coordinated 6 workforce development system for the state and monitor its 7 operation; and

8 2. Review and make recommendations that will align the 9 workforce system, including education, with the economic development 10 goals of the state for the purpose of creating workforce and 11 economic development systems that are integrated and shall provide 12 Oklahoma a competitive advantage in a global economy.

13 Membership of the Council shall include representatives of Β. private employers who reflect Oklahoma's projected and desired 14 15 business and industry base and public officials from agencies which provide programs and services related to workforce, education and 16 economic development. All Council members shall be in positions to 17 influence policy and hiring decisions within their organizations. 18 Initial appointments to the Council shall conform to the following 19 described schedule: 20

21 1. <u>The membership of the Council shall comply with the federal</u> 22 requirements of the state investment board;

23 <u>2.</u> A majority of the Council shall come from described private
 24 sector employers, including owners of businesses, chief executives

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1	or operating officers of businesses or other business executives or		
2	employees with optimum policymaking or hiring authority, and who		
3	represent businesses, including small businesses, that provide		
4	employment opportunities that, at a minimum, include high-quality,		
5	work-relevant training and development in in-demand industry sectors		
6	or occupations in this state;		
7	$\frac{2}{2}$. State officials shall include incumbents or designees of		
8	the following named offices, or their successors in office or		
9	function:		
10	a. Governor,		
11	b. two members of the Senate, appointed by the President		
12	Pro Tempore,		
13	c. two members of the House of Representatives, appointed		
14	by the Speaker,		
15	d. Secretary of Executive Director of the Oklahoma		
16	Department of Commerce and Tourism, and		
17	e. Secretary of Education,		
18	f. Secretary of Human Services,		
19	g. Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher		
20	Education,		
21	h. Director of Career and Technology Education,		
22	i. State Superintendent of Public Instruction,		
23	j. Executive Director of the Oklahoma Employment Security		
24	Commission , and		

1	k. Director of the State Department of Rehabilitation
2	Services,
3	3. Two members from organizations with experience in the
4	delivery of workforce services, including community colleges or
5	other community-based workforce service organizations;
6	4. Two members from organizations or individuals that have
7	experience with respect to youth activities;
8	5. Two members that are chief elected officials from a city and
9	county;
10	6. Two members that represent labor organizations; and
11	7. <u>4.</u> Additional members, at the discretion and pleasure of
12	the Governor, may be appointed representing÷
13	a. local welfare agencies,
14	b. public housing agencies,
15	c. administrators of programs which receive federal or
16	state human resources funding,
17	d. representative of a Local Workforce Board Chairs
18	Association,
19	e. entities with special knowledge and qualifications
20	regarding special educational and career development
21	needs of hard-to-serve individuals,
22	f. state and local economic development representatives,
23	g. juvenile justice programs,
24	h. state human resources organization,

1	i.	representatives of tourism, agriculture, corrections		
2		and transportation,		
3	j.	state organization representing urban-rural hospitals,		
4	k.	representatives of Oklahoma Tribes or Nations, and		
5	1.	representatives of minorities in Oklahoma the needs or		
6		interests of the state economy or specific regional		
7		needs; and		
8	<u>5. Ex-of</u>	ficio members, at the discretion and pleasure of the		
9	Governor, may be included to provide expertise and agency			
10	information t	to the Council. These appointments may include, but not		
11	be limited to:			
12	<u>a.</u>	the Secretary of Education,		
13	<u>b.</u>	the Secretary of Health and Human Services,		
14	<u>C.</u>	the Secretary of Commerce,		
15	<u>d.</u>	the Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for		
16		Higher Education,		
17	<u>e.</u>	the Director of Career and Technology Education,		
18	<u>f.</u>	the State Superintendent of Public Instruction,		
19	<u>g.</u>	the Director of the State Department of Rehabilitation		
20		Services,		
21	<u>h.</u>	the Director of the Oklahoma Department of		
22		Corrections,		
23	<u>i.</u>	the Commissioner of the Oklahoma Department of Mental		
24		Health and Substance Abuse Services,

 the Director of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority,

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k. the Native American Liaison.

Private sector members shall be appointed by and serve at 4 С. 5 the pleasure of the Governor for a two-year term beginning October 1, 2005, and may be reappointed. However, of the initial private 6 sector members appointed, half shall be appointed for an initial 7 term of one (1) year beginning October 1, 2005. Private members may 8 9 be removed from office for failure to attend three consecutive 10 Council meetings. The chair of the Council shall be from the 11 private sector and shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure 12 of the Governor.

D. The Council shall meet at such times and places as it deems 13 appropriate. Members shall serve without compensation. Council 14 15 members employed by a state agency shall be reimbursed travel expenses related to their service on the Council as authorized by 16 state law by their respective state agency. Legislative members of 17 the Council shall be reimbursed by their respective houses for 18 necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their 19 duties as authorized by state law. Remaining Council members shall 20 also be reimbursed travel expenses related to their service on the 21 Council by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce as authorized by 22 state law. No member of the Council shall profit, directly or 23 indirectly, from any transaction with the Council. 24

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E. The duties and responsibilities of the Council in the
 development, monitoring and aligning of the workforce system with
 economic development shall include, but not be limited to:

Performing the duties required of the state governance board
 by the federal Workforce Investment Innovation and Opportunity Act;

2. Identifying the human resource investment needs of Oklahoma
business and industry, together with those of the citizens of the
state, so that each might respond to and meet the needs of the
others and thus together build a robust, diversified economy;

Reviewing and evaluating workforce development programs
 within the state, formulate recommendations to increase their
 efficiency and effectiveness, eliminate duplication, and align with
 economic goals. Recommendations shall be communicated to the
 Governor, Legislature, state and federal government agencies and
 appropriate individuals and entities within the private sector;

16 4. Increasing academic capability and technical skills within 17 the state workforce and foster lifelong learning among Oklahoma's 18 citizens;

Strengthening collaboration among institutions which provide
 education and training services, government agencies which
 coordinate employment and other human resource investment
 activities, and Oklahoma business and industry to create a seamless
 system to nurture healthy economic development; and

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6. Enhancing rural economic development capability and
 capacity, giving particular attention to regional collaboration and
 partnering.

F. Activities of the Council shall be coordinated by the
Secretary of Commerce and Tourism and directed by the Deputy
Secretary of Commerce for Workforce Development, or their successors
in office or function. Administrative and staffing support for the
Council shall be coordinated by the Office of Workforce Solutions
within the Department of Commerce.

10 G. The State Workforce Solutions Staff Team Partners originally 11 established under the authority of Executive Order 2005-27 as the 12 Workforce Solutions Staff Team is hereby recognized by the Legislature. This interagency team shall be comprised of executive 13 level staff from all workforce, education and economic development 14 agencies of the state for the purpose of providing staff support to 15 the Council and to create efficiencies, eliminate duplication, and 16 eliminate barriers to jointly providing a service delivery system. 17 Other members may be included on this team as the Governor τ 18 Secretary of Commerce or Deputy Secretary of Commerce may deem 19 necessary to accomplish this goal. 20

H. The Council shall be supported by funds available to state agencies pursuant to state and federal laws and regulations. Each member of the Council whose agency qualifies pursuant to state and federal law to receive and use such funds shall assist by providing

1 support and funding of the Council in carrying out the responsibilities of the Council. 2 3 I. The Council shall form a subcommittee on health workforce 4 whose purpose shall be to inform, coordinate, and facilitate 5 statewide efforts to ensure that a well-trained, adequately distributed, and flexible health workforce is available to meet the 6 7 needs of an efficient and effective health care system in Oklahoma. Duties of the Health Workforce Subcommittee shall include, but not 8 9 be limited to, the following: 10 1. Conducting data analysis and preparing reports on health workforce supply and demand; 11 12 2. Research and analysis of state health professional education 13 and training capacity; 3. Recommend recruitment and retention strategies for areas 14 determined by the Oklahoma Primary Care Office or the Oklahoma 15 16 Office of Rural Health to be areas of high need; and 4. Assessment of health workforce policy, evaluation of impact 17 on Oklahoma's health system and health outcomes, and developing 18 health workforce policy recommendations. 19 20 SECTION 2.
