7	An Act relating to public health; providing short title; creating the Advisory Council on Social

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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7301 of Title 63, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
21	Health in All Policies Act".
22	B. There is hereby created to continue until September 1, 2016,
23	the Advisory Council on Social Determinants of Health. The purpose
24	of the Advisory Council shall be to:

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1. Review data and propose policy solutions to improve health outcomes among disadvantaged communities; and

- 2. Update the Oklahoma State Legislature on existing programs to improve health outcomes in this state including, but not limited to, programs administered or financed in whole or in part by any agency of this state, any nonprofit organization or any privatesector entity.
- C. The Advisory Council on Social Determinants of Health shall consist of eleven (11) members to be appointed as follows:
- 1. Four shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives as follows:
  - a. one shall be a member of the majority party of the

    House of Representatives with knowledge of public

    health issues,
  - b. one shall be a member of the minority party of the House of Representatives with knowledge of public health issues,
  - c. one shall be a representative of the social services nonprofit community, and
  - d. one shall be a representative of the health and wellness community;
- 2. Four shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate as follows:

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a. one shall be a member of the majority party of the

Senate with knowledge of public health issues,

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- b. one shall be a member of the minority party of the Senate with knowledge of public health issues,
- c. one shall be a representative of the education community, and
- d. one shall be a member of the medical community; and
- 3. Three shall be appointed by the Governor as follows:
  - a. one shall be the State Commissioner of Health or a designee,
  - b. one shall be the State Superintendent of Public Instruction or a designee, and
  - c. one shall be the Commissioner of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services or a designee.
- D. Appointments to the Advisory Council shall be made by September 1, 2015. Advisory Council members shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing authorities. A vacancy on the Advisory Council shall be filled by the original appointing authority.
- E. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each designate a cochair from among the members of the Advisory Council. A majority of the members of the Advisory Council shall constitute a quorum to do business. The Senate and House of Representatives shall, at the discretion of the President Pro Tempore and the Speaker of the House of

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Representatives, provide staff support to the Advisory Council as necessary to assist in the performance of its duties.

- F. Members of the Advisory Council shall determine meeting dates. Members shall not be compensated for their service but may be reimbursed by their appointing authorities for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, as follows:
- 1. Legislative members may be reimbursed for their necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the provisions of Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 2. Nonlegislative members who are state officers or employees may be reimbursed by their respective agencies for their necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act; and
- 3. Members who are not legislators or state officers or employees of the state may be reimbursed by their appointing authorities in accordance with the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
- G. The proceedings of all meetings of the Advisory Council shall comply with the provisions of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and Oklahoma Open Records Act.
- H. The Advisory Council shall include an examination of the following in its assessment and recommendations:

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- 1. State trends in the numbers of chronic and preventable illnesses including, but not limited to, heart disease and diabetes;
- 2. The state's role in improving access to healthy foods in disadvantaged communities;
- 3. State policy regarding the promotion of exercise and physical wellness; and
- 4. Existing services, resources, and capacity including, but not limited to, the availability of publicly or privately provided resources to improve health outcomes in disadvantaged communities.
- I. The Advisory Council shall submit a report to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Governor by September 1, 2016, describing assessment and recommendations provided for by subsection H of this act.
  - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2015.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
