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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2021, Section 6-310, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 6-310. A. The Commissioner of the State Board of
18	Agriculture may commission, subject to the approval of the Board,
19	agriculture law enforcement agents.
20	B. Agriculture law enforcement agents, when commissioned,
21	shall:
22	1. Have all the powers of peace officers except the serving or
23	execution of civil process other than the execution of civil process
24	related to the Oklahoma Agricultural Code;

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Have in all parts of the state the same powers with respect
 to criminal matters and enforcement of the laws relating thereto as
 sheriffs, highway patrol, and police officers in their respective
 jurisdictions;

3. Enforce the civil, criminal, and administrative provisions
relating to livestock theft, animal health and importation statutes
and theft of farming equipment and farm implements, as well as any
other law contained in the Oklahoma Agricultural Code;

9 4. Possess all immunities and matters of defense now available 10 or hereafter made available to sheriffs, highway patrol and police 11 officers in any suit brought against them in consequence of acts 12 done in the course of their employment; and

13 5. Comply with the provisions of Section 3311 of Title 70 of14 the Oklahoma Statutes.

15 C. Agriculture law enforcement agents specifically:

Are vested with the power and authority of sheriffs in
 making arrests for violations of the Oklahoma Agricultural Code and
 in the enforcement of nonagriculture-related crimes in cooperation
 with other law enforcement officers and agencies as authorized by
 the Board and approved by the Governor of the State of Oklahoma;

2. May take into possession any farming equipment or farm
 implement and any and all livestock, or any part thereof, killed,
 taken, shipped or had in possession contrary to the law. Such

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livestock or parts thereof may be disposed of as determined by the
 Commissioner or any court of competent jurisdiction;

3 3. May make a complaint and cause proceedings to be commenced 4 against any person for violation of any of the laws relating to the 5 Oklahoma Agricultural Code or relating to theft of livestock and of 6 farming equipment or farm implements, with the sanction of the 7 prosecuting or district attorney of the county in which the 8 proceedings are brought, and shall not be required to give security 9 for costs;

10 4. In connection with the enforcement of the civil, criminal, 11 and administrative provisions, shall have the express authority to 12 stop the transportation or movement of any animal or farming 13 equipment or farm implement within this state and shall have the 14 right to enter upon all premises, posted, or otherwise, when 15 necessary for enforcement of the laws of this state;

5. Shall be under the control and direction of the
Commissioner. The Commissioner may, at any time, remove any powers
or authority of arrest conferred by the Commissioner; and

Shall have the right to carry firearms as authorized by the
 Commissioner.

21 <u>D. All agriculture law enforcement agents commissioned as</u> 22 provided in subsection A of this section shall be provided a salary 23 <u>as follows:</u>

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<u>1. For the state fiscal years beginning on or after July 1,</u>
 <u>2023, and ending on or prior to June 30, 2025, an amount no less</u>
 <u>3 than ninety percent (90%) of the average salary paid to the rank of</u>
 <u>4 Trooper for the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division of the Department</u>
 <u>5 of Public Safety during the state fiscal year ending June 30, 2022;</u>
 <u>6 and</u>

7 2. Starting with the state fiscal year beginning on July 1, 8 2025, and in each state fiscal year that begins in an odd-numbered 9 calendar year thereafter, such salary shall be adjusted to be no 10 less than ninety percent (90%) of the average salary paid to the 11 rank of Trooper for the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division of the 12 Department of Public Safety during the most recent state fiscal year 13 ending in an even-numbered calendar year; provided that no 14 adjustment shall be made that would result in the reduction of an 15 applicable salary amount. 16 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023. 17 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 18 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 19 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 20 be in full force from and after its passage and approval. 21 22 59-1-7962 JM 03/03/23 23

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
