**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 4002**

1 Delete lines 4 through 8 of the printed bill and insert:

2 **“SECTION 1. (1) The office for Drug Prevention and Treatment is**
3 **created within the office of the Governor. The Governor shall appoint**
4 **an executive officer for the office for Drug Prevention and Treatment.**
5 **The executive officer:**

6 **“(a) Shall coordinate all drug prevention and treatment programs**
7 **that are directly funded by the state, including but not limited to:**

8 **“(A) Programs for drug intervention and treatment under a**
9 **Strengthening, Preserving and Reunifying Families program described**
10 **in ORS 418.580;**

11 **“(B) Programs administered by the Director of the Oregon Health**
12 **Authority under ORS 430.256;**

13 **“(C) Programs provided directly by the Oregon Health Authority or**
14 **indirectly by contract with publicly or privately operated profit or**
15 **nonprofit facilities for the care of individuals with substance use dis-**
16 **orders under ORS 430.335;**

17 **“(D) Programs funded through the Drug Addiction Treatment and**
18 **Recovery Act, ORS 430.383 to 430.390 and 430.394;**

19 **“(E) Programs for integrating drug treatment services into the**
20 **criminal justice system under ORS 430.420 (3);**

21 **“(F) Programs administered with funding from the Drug Prevention**

1 and Education Fund established in ORS 430.422;

2 “(G) Programs providing detoxification and detoxification with
3 acupuncture and counseling under ORS 430.560;

4 “(H) Programs providing crisis stabilization services through the
5 statewide coordinated crisis system described in ORS 430.626 to 430.628;
6 and

7 “(I) Regional centers for the treatment of adolescents with drug and
8 alcohol dependencies under ORS 430.709; and

9 “(b) May coordinate programs that provide grants to private or-
10 ganizations to operate drug prevention and treatment programs, in-
11 cluding but not limited to:

12 “(A) Grantees of community violence prevention grants that pro-
13 vide substance use disorder treatment under ORS 184.521;

14 “(B) Grantees that provide comprehensive community supports and
15 services for individuals with substance use disorders through the Im-
16 proving People’s Access to Community-based Treatment, Supports and
17 Services program established in ORS 430.231;

18 “(C) Grantees that provide drug abuse prevention, early inter-
19 vention and treatment services with funding provided under ORS
20 430.345;

21 “(D) Residential treatment facilities for individuals with substance
22 use disorders funded under ORS 430.643 with moneys disbursed from
23 the Behavioral Health Housing Incentive Fund established in ORS
24 430.641; and

25 “(E) Subgrantees that provide substance use disorder treatment
26 with funding provided by the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission
27 through the Northwest Health Foundation Fund II under section 15,
28 chapter 78, Oregon Laws 2022.

29 “(2) The executive officer shall appoint five associate directors, each
30 assigned to a geographic region of this state, to assist the executive

1 **officer in the coordination of programs in each region.**

2 **“(3) The executive officer may be removed for cause by the Gover-**
3 **nor. The Governor shall replace an executive officer removed under**
4 **this section without delay. If the position of the executive officer be-**
5 **comes vacant, an associate director named by the Governor shall serve**
6 **as the acting executive officer until a new executive officer has been**
7 **appointed.**

8 **“(4) The executive officer is in the exempt service.**

9 **“(5)(a) The executive officer shall select, appoint and fix the com-**
10 **penensation of the associate directors.**

11 **“(b) The executive officer may delegate to an associate director any**
12 **authority, power or duty to act possessed by the executive officer ex-**
13 **cept the power to delegate set forth in this paragraph.**

14 **“(6)(a) The executive officer may hire and fix the compensation of**
15 **other professional staff to assist in performing the duties assigned to**
16 **the executive officer.**

17 **“(b) Associate directors and employees of the office for Drug Pre-**
18 **vention and Treatment are in the exempt service.**

19 **“(7) The executive officer may seek out office facilities and admin-**
20 **istrative support from other state agencies or local public bodies. State**
21 **agencies shall assist the executive officer. Local public bodies may**
22 **assist the executive officer.**

23 **“SECTION 2. (1) The executive officer of the office for Drug Pre-**
24 **vention and Treatment shall convene a work group to determine and**
25 **plan for the best use of the Dome Building on the campus of the**
26 **Oregon State Hospital in Salem as a residential treatment facility**
27 **serving the entire state by providing substance use and mental health**
28 **treatment for individuals who:**

29 **“(a) Have been committed to the custody of the Oregon Health**
30 **Authority under ORS 426.130; or**

1 “(b) Need treatment for or who are in recovery from substance use
2 disorders.

3 “(2) The plan for using the Dome Building as a residential treat-
4 ment facility developed under subsection (1) of this section must en-
5 sure that upon discharge, residents are placed back in the
6 communities where they resided before entering residential treatment.

7 “(3) No later than February 3, 2025, the executive officer shall report
8 to the committees of the Legislative Assembly related to behavioral
9 health, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, the determinations and
10 plans for the Dome Building developed by the work group under this
11 section.

12 “SECTION 3. Section 1 of this 2024 Act is repealed on January 2,
13 2027.

14 “SECTION 4. Section 2 of this 2024 Act is repealed on January 2,
15 2026.”.

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
