Mr. HAWLEY introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

## A BILL

To extend concealed carry rights to Federal judges and prosecutors.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PROMOTING CONCEALED CARRY RIGHTS FOR**  
4 **LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.**

5 (a) AMENDMENTS.—Section 926B of title 18, United  
6 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-  
7 lowing:

8 “(g) For purposes of this section, a Federal judge,  
9 a Federal magistrate judge, or a Federal prosecutor shall  
10 be considered to be qualified law enforcement officer if the

1 judge, magistrate judge, or prosecutor meets the criteria  
2 described in paragraphs (5) and (6) of subsection (c).

3 “(h) The Attorney General, or any United States At-  
4 torney, may file a civil action against any State govern-  
5 ment, State agency, or State employee to enjoin any ac-  
6 tions or practices that impede qualified law enforcement  
7 officers from carrying a concealed firearm under sub-  
8 section (a).”.

9 (b) REGULATIONS AND GUIDANCE.—The Attorney  
10 General shall—

11 (1) promulgate regulations and issue guidance  
12 to implement subsection (h) of section 926B of title  
13 18, United States Code, as added by subsection (a)  
14 of this section; and

15 (2) develop and implement programs for quali-  
16 fied law enforcement officers to report when they are  
17 impeded from carrying a concealed firearm under  
18 section 926B of title 18, United States Code, and to  
19 ascertain what remedial actions the Department of  
20 Justice has taken.

21 (c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There  
22 are authorized to be appropriated \$10,000,000 to the De-  
23 partment of Justice to carry out this section.
