SENATE BILL 5050

State of Washington 65th Legislature 2017 Regular Session

By Senators Frockt, Ranker, Kuderer, Wellman, Saldaña, and Liias; by request of Attorney General

1 AN ACT Relating to assault weapons and large capacity magazines; 2 amending RCW 9.41.010; and adding a new section to chapter 9.41 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 9.41.010 and 2015 c 1 s 2 (Initiative Measure No. 5 594) are each amended to read as follows:

6 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in 7 this section apply throughout this chapter.

(1) "Antique firearm" means a firearm or replica of a firearm not 8 designed or redesigned for using rim fire or conventional center fire 9 ignition with fixed ammunition and manufactured in or before 1898, 10 11 including any matchlock, flintlock, percussion cap, or similar type ignition system and also any firearm using fixed ammunition 12 of manufactured in or before 1898, for which ammunition is no longer 13 14 manufactured in the United States and is not readily available in the ordinary channels of commercial trade. 15

16 (2) "Barrel length" means the distance from the bolt face of a 17 closed action down the length of the axis of the bore to the crown of 18 the muzzle, or in the case of a barrel with attachments to the end of 19 any legal device permanently attached to the end of the muzzle.

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(3) "Crime of violence" means:

(a) Any of the following felonies, as now existing or hereafter 1 amended: Any felony defined under any law as a class A felony or an 2 attempt to commit a class A felony, criminal solicitation of or 3 criminal conspiracy to commit a class A felony, manslaughter in the 4 first degree, manslaughter in the second degree, indecent liberties 5 б if committed by forcible compulsion, kidnapping in the second degree, 7 arson in the second degree, assault in the second degree, assault of a child in the second degree, extortion in the first degree, burglary 8 in the second degree, residential burglary, and robbery in the second 9 degree; 10

(b) Any conviction for a felony offense in effect at any time prior to June 6, 1996, which is comparable to a felony classified as a crime of violence in (a) of this subsection; and

14 (c) Any federal or out-of-state conviction for an offense 15 comparable to a felony classified as a crime of violence under (a) or 16 (b) of this subsection.

17 (4) "Dealer" means a person engaged in the business of selling firearms at wholesale or retail who has, or is required to have, a 18 federal firearms license under 18 U.S.C. Sec. 923(a). A person who 19 does not have, and is not required to have, a federal firearms 20 21 license under 18 U.S.C. Sec. 923(a), is not a dealer if that person makes only occasional sales, exchanges, or purchases of firearms for 22 the enhancement of a personal collection or for a hobby, or sells all 23 or part of his or her personal collection of firearms. 24

25 (5) "Family or household member" means "family" or "household 26 member" as used in RCW 10.99.020.

27 (6) "Felony" means any felony offense under the laws of this 28 state or any federal or out-of-state offense comparable to a felony 29 offense under the laws of this state.

(7) "Felony firearm offender" means a person who has previously 30 31 been convicted or found not guilty by reason of insanity in this state of any felony firearm offense. A person is not a felony firearm 32 offender under this chapter if any and all qualifying offenses have 33 been the subject of an expungement, pardon, annulment, certificate, 34 or rehabilitation, or other equivalent procedure based on a finding 35 36 of the rehabilitation of the person convicted or a pardon, annulment, or other equivalent procedure based on a finding of innocence. 37

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(8) "Felony firearm offense" means:

39 (a) Any felony offense that is a violation of this chapter;

40 (b) A violation of RCW 9A.36.045;

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(c) A violation of RCW 9A.56.300;

(d) A violation of RCW 9A.56.310;

3 (e) Any felony offense if the offender was armed with a firearm4 in the commission of the offense.

5 (9) "Firearm" means a weapon or device from which a projectile or 6 projectiles may be fired by an explosive such as gunpowder.

(10) "Gun" has the same meaning as firearm.

8 (11) "Law enforcement officer" includes a general authority 9 Washington peace officer as defined in RCW 10.93.020, or a specially 10 commissioned Washington peace officer as defined in RCW 10.93.020. 11 "Law enforcement officer" also includes a limited authority 12 Washington peace officer as defined in RCW 10.93.020 if such officer 13 is duly authorized by his or her employer to carry a concealed 14 pistol.

(12) "Lawful permanent resident" has the same meaning afforded a person "lawfully admitted for permanent residence" in 8 U.S.C. Sec. 17 1101(a)(20).

18 (13) "Licensed dealer" means a person who is federally licensed19 under 18 U.S.C. Sec. 923(a).

20 (14) "Loaded" means:

21 (a) There is a cartridge in the chamber of the firearm;

(b) Cartridges are in a clip that is locked in place in the firearm;

24 (c) There is a cartridge in the cylinder of the firearm, if the 25 firearm is a revolver;

26 (d) There is a cartridge in the tube or magazine that is inserted 27 in the action; or

(e) There is a ball in the barrel and the firearm is capped orprimed if the firearm is a muzzle loader.

30 (15) "Machine gun" means any firearm known as a machine gun, 31 mechanical rifle, submachine gun, or any other mechanism or 32 instrument not requiring that the trigger be pressed for each shot 33 and having a reservoir clip, disc, drum, belt, or other separable 34 mechanical device for storing, carrying, or supplying ammunition 35 which can be loaded into the firearm, mechanism, or instrument, and 36 fired therefrom at the rate of five or more shots per second.

37 (16) "Nonimmigrant alien" means a person defined as such in 8
38 U.S.C. Sec. 1101(a)(15).

(17) "Person" means any individual, corporation, company,
 association, firm, partnership, club, organization, society, joint
 stock company, or other legal entity.

4 (18) "Pistol" means any firearm with a barrel less than sixteen 5 inches in length, or is designed to be held and fired by the use of a 6 single hand.

7 (19) "Rifle" means a weapon designed or redesigned, made or 8 remade, and intended to be fired from the shoulder and designed or 9 redesigned, made or remade, and intended to use the energy of the 10 explosive in a fixed metallic cartridge to fire only a single 11 projectile through a rifled bore for each single pull of the trigger.

(20) "Sale" and "sell" mean the actual approval of the deliveryof a firearm in consideration of payment or promise of payment.

14 (21) "Serious offense" means any of the following felonies or a 15 felony attempt to commit any of the following felonies, as now 16 existing or hereafter amended:

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(a) Any crime of violence;

(b) Any felony violation of the uniform controlled substances act, chapter 69.50 RCW, that is classified as a class B felony or that has a maximum term of imprisonment of at least ten years;

21 (c) Child molestation in the second degree;

22 (d) Incest when committed against a child under age fourteen;

23 (e) Indecent liberties;

24 (f) Leading organized crime;

25 (g) Promoting prostitution in the first degree;

26 (h) Rape in the third degree;

27 (i) Drive-by shooting;

28 (j) Sexual exploitation;

(k) Vehicular assault, when caused by the operation or driving of a vehicle by a person while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or any drug or by the operation or driving of a vehicle in a reckless manner;

(1) Vehicular homicide, when proximately caused by the driving of any vehicle by any person while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or any drug as defined by RCW 46.61.502, or by the operation of any vehicle in a reckless manner;

(m) Any other class B felony offense with a finding of sexual
 motivation, as "sexual motivation" is defined under RCW 9.94A.030;

39 (n) Any other felony with a deadly weapon verdict under RCW 40 9.94A.825; 1 (o) Any felony offense in effect at any time prior to June 6, 2 1996, that is comparable to a serious offense, or any federal or out-3 of-state conviction for an offense that under the laws of this state 4 would be a felony classified as a serious offense; or

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(p) Any felony conviction under RCW 9.41.115.

6 (22) "Short-barreled rifle" means a rifle having one or more 7 barrels less than sixteen inches in length and any weapon made from a 8 rifle by any means of modification if such modified weapon has an 9 overall length of less than twenty-six inches.

10 (23) "Short-barreled shotgun" means a shotgun having one or more 11 barrels less than eighteen inches in length and any weapon made from 12 a shotgun by any means of modification if such modified weapon has an 13 overall length of less than twenty-six inches.

14 (24) "Shotgun" means a weapon with one or more barrels, designed 15 or redesigned, made or remade, and intended to be fired from the 16 shoulder and designed or redesigned, made or remade, and intended to 17 use the energy of the explosive in a fixed shotgun shell to fire 18 through a smooth bore either a number of ball shot or a single 19 projectile for each single pull of the trigger.

(25) "Transfer" means the intended delivery of a firearm to
 another person without consideration of payment or promise of payment
 including, but not limited to, gifts and loans.

(26) "Unlicensed person" means any person who is not a licenseddealer under this chapter.

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(27) "Assault weapon" means:

26 <u>(a) A semiautomatic rifle that has the capacity to accept a</u> 27 detachable magazine and has one or more of the following:

28 (i) A pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously beneath the action 29 of the weapon;

- 30 <u>(ii) A thumbhole stock;</u>
- 31 (iii) A folding or telescoping stock;
- 32 <u>(iv) A second handgrip or a protruding grip that can be held by</u>
 33 <u>the nontrigger hand;</u>

34 <u>(v) A flash suppressor, muzzle break, muzzle compensator, or</u> 35 <u>threaded barrel designed to accommodate a flash suppressor, muzzle</u> 36 <u>break, or muzzle compensator;</u>

37 (vi) A grenade launcher or flare launcher;

38 (b) A semiautomatic pistol, or a semiautomatic, centerfire, or 39 rimfire rifle with a fixed magazine, that has the capacity to accept

40 more than ten rounds of ammunition;

1	<u>(c) A semiautomatic pistol that has the capacity to accept a</u>
2	detachable magazine and has one or more of the following:
3	(i) Any feature capable of functioning as a protruding grip that
4	can be held by the nontrigger hand;
5	(ii) A threaded barrel, capable of accepting a flash suppressor,
6	forward handgrip, or silencer;
7	(iii) A shroud attached to the barrel, or that partially or
8	completely encircles the barrel, allowing the bearer to hold the
9	firearm with the nontrigger hand without being burned, but excluding
10	a slide that encloses the barrel; or
11	(iv) The capacity to accept a detachable magazine at any location
12	outside of the pistol grip;
13	(d) A semiautomatic, centerfire, or rimfire rifle that has an
14	overall length of less than thirty inches;
15	(e) A semiautomatic shotgun that has both of the following:
16	(i) A pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously beneath the action
17	of the weapon, thumbhole stock, or vertical handgrip;
18	(ii) A folding or telescoping stock; or
19	(iii) An ability to accept a detachable magazine;
20	(f) A shotgun with a revolving cylinder; or
21	(g) A conversion kit, part, or combination of parts, from which
22	an assault weapon can be assembled if those parts are in the
23	possession or under the control of the same person.
24	"Assault weapon" does not include antique firearms, any firearm
25	that has been made permanently inoperable, or any firearm that is
26	manually operated by bolt, pump, lever, or slide action.
27	(28) "Detachable magazine" means an ammunition feeding device
28	that can be loaded or unloaded while detached from a firearm and
29	readily inserted into a firearm.
30	(29) "Large capacity magazine" means an ammunition feeding device
31	with the capacity to accept more than ten rounds of ammunition, or
32	any conversion kit, part, or combination of parts, from which such a
33	device can be assembled if those parts are in the possession or under
34	the control of the same person, but shall not be construed to include
35	any of the following:
36	(a) An ammunition feeding device that has been permanently
37	altered so that it cannot accommodate more than ten rounds of
38	ammunition;
39	(b) A twenty-two caliber tube ammunition feeding device; or

1 (c) A tubular magazine that is contained in a lever-action
2 firearm.

3 (30) "Secure gun storage" means a safe, gun safe, gun case, lock 4 box, or other device that is designed to be or can be used to store a 5 firearm and that is designed to be unlocked only by means of a key, 6 combination, or other similar means, and that is constructed of such 7 guality workmanship and material that it cannot be pried open or 8 easily removed or defeated.

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 9.41 RCW 10 to read as follows:

(1) No person in this state may manufacture, possess, distribute, import, transfer, sell, offer for sale, purchase, or otherwise transfer any assault weapon or large capacity magazine except as authorized in this section.

15 (2) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to any of the 16 following:

(a) The possession of an assault weapon or large capacity 17 magazine by a person who legally possessed the assault weapon or 18 large capacity magazine on the effective date of this section, or 19 20 possession of an assault weapon or large capacity magazine by a person who, on or after the effective date of this section, acquires 21 possession of the assault weapon or large capacity magazine by 22 operation of law upon the death of the former owner who was in legal 23 24 possession of the assault weapon or large capacity magazine, provided 25 the person in possession of the assault weapon or large capacity magazine can establish such provenance. A person who legally 26 27 possesses an assault weapon or large capacity magazine under this 28 subsection (2)(a) may not sell or transfer the assault weapon to any other person in this state other than to a licensed dealer, to a 29 30 federally licensed gun smith for the purpose of service or repair, or 31 а law enforcement agency for the purpose of permanently to relinquishing the assault weapon or large capacity magazine; 32

33 (b) Any government officer, agent, or employee, member of the 34 armed forces of the United States or the state of Washington, or law 35 enforcement officer, to the extent that such person is otherwise 36 authorized to acquire or possess an assault weapon or large capacity 37 magazine and does so while acting within the scope of his or her 38 duties;

1 (c) The manufacture, offering for sale, sale, importation, or 2 transfer of an assault weapon or large capacity magazine by a 3 licensed firearms manufacturer for the purposes of sale to any branch 4 of the armed forces of the United States or the state of Washington, 5 or to a law enforcement agency in this state for use by that agency 6 or its employees;

7 (d) The possession, offering for sale, sale, importation, or 8 transfer of an assault weapon or large capacity magazine by a dealer 9 that is properly licensed under federal and state law for the purpose 10 of sale to any branch of the armed forces of the United States or the 11 state of Washington, or to a law enforcement agency in this state for 12 use by that agency or its employees for law enforcement purposes;

(e) The possession, offering for sale, sale, importation, or 13 14 transfer of an assault weapon or large capacity magazine by a dealer that is properly licensed under federal and state law where the 15 16 dealer acquires the assault weapon or large capacity magazine from a 17 person legally authorized to possess or transfer the assault weapon or large capacity magazine under (a) of this subsection for the 18 purpose of selling or transferring the assault weapon or large 19 capacity magazine to a person who does not reside in this state; 20

(f) The transfer to and possession of a legally possessed assault weapon or large capacity magazine by a federally licensed gunsmith for the purposes of service or repair, and the return of the assault weapon or large capacity magazine to the lawful owner;

(g) The possession, offering for sale, sale, importation, or transfer of an unloaded assault weapon for the purpose of permanently relinquishing it to a law enforcement agency in this state;

(h) The importation or possession of an assault weapon or large capacity magazine for the purpose of lawfully participating in a sporting event officially sanctioned by a club or organization established in whole or in part for the purpose of sponsoring sport shooting events;

(i) The possession, importation, purchase, or transfer of an assault weapon or large capacity magazine by marshals, sheriffs, prison or jail wardens or their deputies, or other law enforcement officers of this or another state while acting within the scope of their duties, including such possession while not on duty, but specifically authorized by command staff and necessary for the performance of such duties;

1 (j) The possession of an assault weapon or large capacity 2 magazine by law enforcement officers retired for service or physical 3 disabilities, when the assault weapon or large capacity magazine in 4 question was acquired as part of the officer's separation from 5 service;

6 (k) Members of the armed forces of the United States or of the 7 national guard or organized services, when on duty;

8 (1) Officers or employees of the United States duly authorized to9 possess assault weapons or large capacity magazines;

10 (m) Any persons lawfully engaged in shooting at a duly licensed, 11 lawfully operated shooting range; or

(n) The possession or transfer of an unloaded assault weapon or large capacity magazine for the purpose of permanently relinquishing it to a law enforcement agency in this state. An assault weapon or large capacity magazine relinquished to a law enforcement agency under this subsection must be destroyed.

17 (3) In order to continue to possess an assault weapon or large 18 capacity magazine that was legally possessed on the effective date of 19 this section, the person possessing the assault weapon or large 20 capacity magazine shall:

(a) Store the assault weapon or large capacity magazine in asecure gun storage; and

(b) Possess the assault weapon or large capacity magazine only on 23 24 property owned or immediately controlled by the person, or while 25 engaged in the legal use of the assault weapon or large capacity 26 magazine at a duly licensed firing range, or while engaged in a lawful outdoor recreational activity such as hunting, or while 27 traveling to or from either of these locations for the purpose of 28 29 engaging in the legal use of the assault weapon or large capacity magazine, provided that the assault weapon or large capacity magazine 30 31 stored unloaded and in a separate locked container during is 32 transport.

(4) A person who violates this section is guilty of a class Cfelony punishable under chapter 9A.20 RCW.

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. If any provision of this act or its 36 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
